Broadleaf/Roughleaf Aster	<i>Aster radulinus</i>	* found by Lech Naumovich on Aug. 31, 2011

Indian Thistle	<i>Cirsium brevistylum</i>	
Spotted Coralroot	<i>Corallorhiza maculata</i>	* found May 4, 2010, by jogger on upper trail near Evergreen.
